Other Notes: Auguste Rodin was first acquainted with Cambodian court dancers upon their accompanying King Sisowath and his daughter Princess Soumhady to the colonial exhibition held in Marseille, 1906. At the time Cambodia had been under French protectorate since 1884, and the Cambodian entourage and Rodin were the mutual guests of the French Republic at a gala for the occasion. Upon watching the Cambodian ballet dancers at the gala, and subsequently numerous times during the remainder of their six week visit, Rodin was completely captivated by them. He was mesmerized by everything from their costumes to their movements. Rodin describes the time spent with the dancers of King Sisowath of Cambodia, "I have spent the four most wonderful days of my life with my pretty friends..." Rodin goes on to describe the many ways in which the experience has moved him. He stated that, "The Cambodian dancers have revealed movements to me that I have never found anywhere before, either in the art of sculpture or nature." As similarly portrayed in this sketch, Rodin discusses, "...that longitudinal motion they create by stretching out their arms, turning their hands up, and spreading their fingers... or the pose I have sketched here, showing the dancer crouched down almost to the ground, leaning forward, one bent knee touching her breast and her feet thrown out behind her. Isn't this wonderfully lovely and new?"

The sketch Cambodian Dancer en face from the collection of the Museé Rodin (D.4449), as illustrated in Güse, pg. 282, plate 163, illustrates very similar outstretched arm and hand gestures, and leg position.
